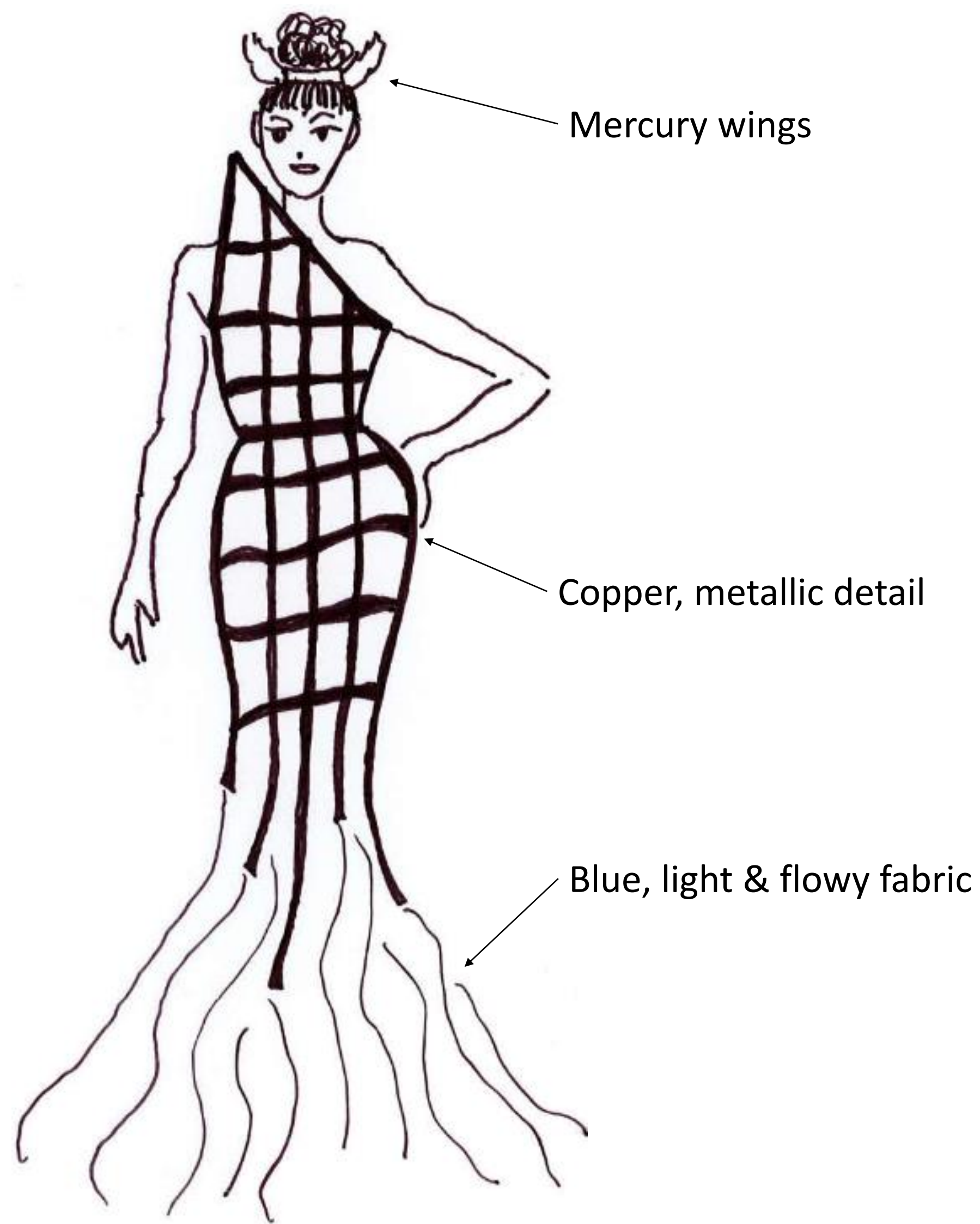


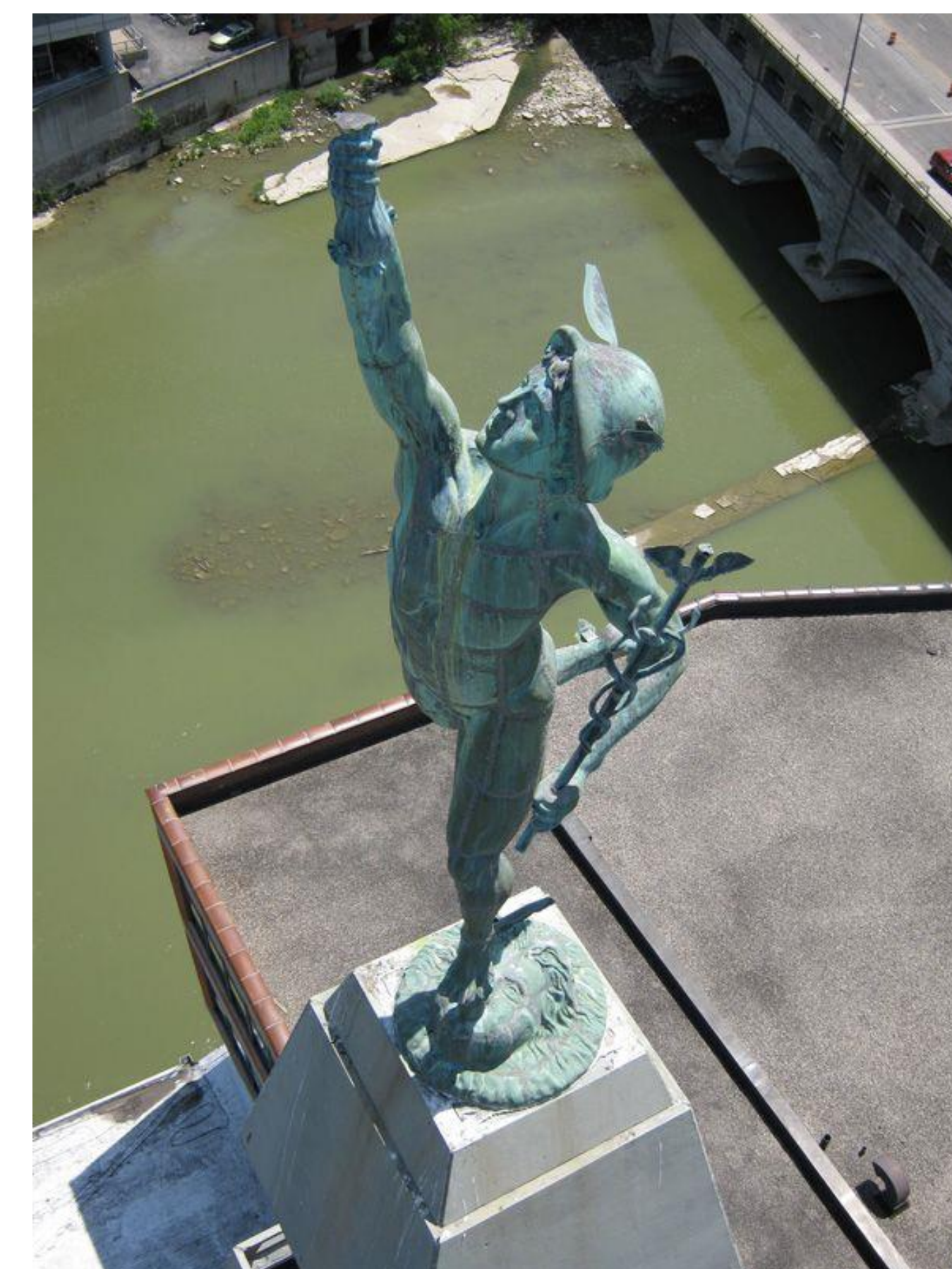
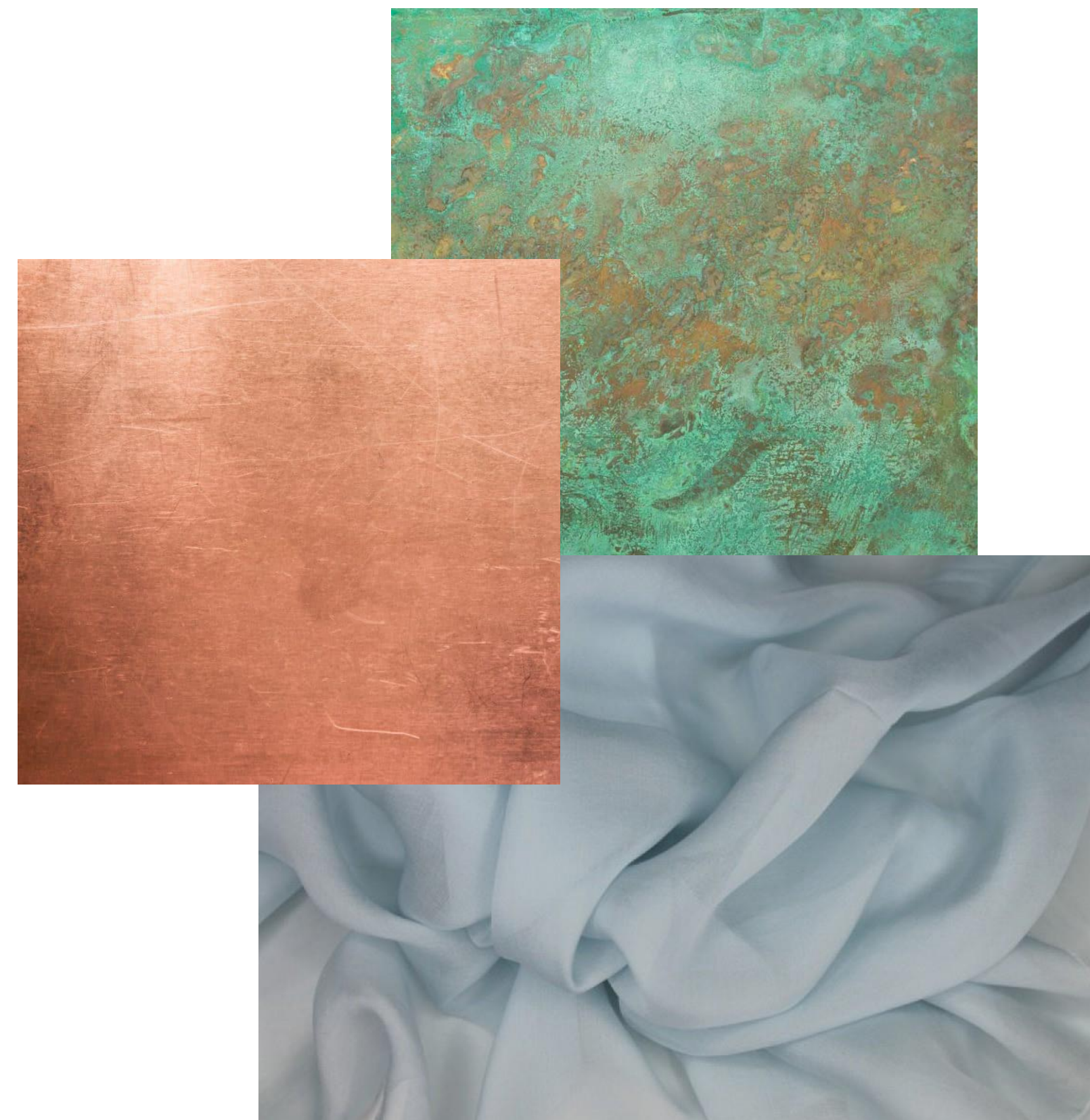
## Concept

The Aqueduct Building, known then as the Lawyers Co-Operative Publishing Company Building, was first constructed in 1890. It was built on top of the Genesee River and was eventually neighbored by the Rochester Subway System in the 1920s. Today, the building is a landmark in the Rochester skyline, in part thanks to the Mercury statue that was relocated onto the building in 1974.

We were inspired by the patch-work look to the Mercury statue, as well as the repeating pattern of the many windows on the building. Directly below the building flows the Genesee River, which gives a beautiful contrast to the rigid form of the building. Borrowing the red and orange tones of the brick and the original copper of Mercury, we plan to create a structured, warm-toned net that encapsulates a light and flowing dress underneath. This design will represent the power of the Aqueduct Building, as it sits atop the Genesee River and lifts Mercury above the city skyline.
